Matthew 22. 34 – end

Jesus used words from Deuteronomy 6:5 and
Leviticus 19:18. The most important command is part
of what the Jews call the Shema. It is their statement
of what they believe. So Jews say the Shema every
day. The most important of God's commands is that
people should love him. They should love him with
their whole soul - the whole of their thoughts, all of
their feelings and their entire life.

Jesus added a second command. When people
really love God, then they love other people. We
should love other people as much as we love
ourselves, Jesus said.
